BASIC CAMPER



This award may be earned at an overnight, weekend, or a multi-night camp. One camp will consist of two consecutive nights. Camping should be done in tents.

Award Requirements

Part A	Participate in meal planning to ensure suitable meals and snacks are available.
Part B	Help make a kit list. Pack your own gear and take care of your personal belongings at camp.
Part C	 Help with patrol duties at camp, such as the following: Pitching, caring for and striking a tent Caring for washrooms or toilets Making and maintaining a woodpile, or caring for and storing the camp stove and fuel Making camp gadgets Cooking, doing dishes and cleaning up Sorting and disposing of garbage and recyclables Caring for camp tools and equipment
Part D	 Develop a Be Prepared plan. Create skits or make up games to learn and understand the following safety precautions: If you're lost, stay in one place because this helps people find you. Wear clothing appropriate for the weather, including footwear that will protect your feet and a hat to prevent heat loss or protect you from the sun. Use the buddy system to help keep track of where people are during camp. Know the camp's address, emergency phone numbers and how to give directions to the camp.

Part F	Know other safety precautions to take at camp. With one of your Guide leaders or a caring adult, check for potential hazards in and around your campsite and understand how you can avoid them.
Part G	Play a wide game or other outdoor activity at camp.
Part H	Help plan and take part in at least one Girl Guide ceremony while at camp (e.g., a flag ceremony, Guides' Own or campfire).
Part I	Explore the area around your campsite. Observe the natural features - trees, plants, streams, hills and so on. Be prepared to discuss what you think has changed because of human actions and how you think the area can be preserved for the future.
Part J	With others, evaluate your camping experience.
