Welcome to the Council / Committee Team!



In addition to being a District and Area Commissioner, she also served as staff for National Camps. One of her personal goals was to travel to all the World Centers and her last adventure took her to India (pictured her at Sangam) in 2018. She is an amateur runner, completing in marathons, and loves to craft with quilting being one of her passions.

In her current role she identifies and mitigates exposure to risks that threaten the Provincial Council's ability to accomplish the Mission of GGC. Safe Guide, GGC's Risk Management Strategy, is also in this

portfolio and Anja works closely with the Safe Guide Adviser to ensure the risk management practices are followed.

Sally Safety Says....BEE SAFE!



This is a new section that will feature some need to know as well as hints and tips to make planning of unit meetings, camps and events easier as it relates to Safe Guide.

Wilderness First Aid Training

Wilderness first aid training is not a requirement for most GGC activities. Safe Guide determines the first aid requirements needed to ensure safety at their activities and states:

Red Level where Emergency Medical Services (EMS) response time is more than four hours: The Responsible Guider must verify that at least one adult is certified in Wilderness First Aid (even if they are a health care professional).

A Guider needs Standard first aid for a Red level activity; however, Wilderness first aid is only required for Red level activities with an EMS response time over four hours.

So lets talk EMS.....

Emergency Response Time

There have been inquiries and concerns in relation to emergency medical services response time and whether some events (like an event on McNab's Island) are Red level events. It is important that Guiders check Safe Guide for guidance when planning an activity.

Safe Guide states:

EMS response time: The length of time it takes an EMS agency to respond to a medical emergency in the location where your event is taking place. EMS may include ambulance, fire (career and volunteer), police, land management (park staff), and other types of services available to a specific area/location such as a community nursing station.

- First aid training required for activities are:
- ♣ Green recommended (but not mandatory) that at least one adult have Emergency First Aid
- Yellow recommended (but not mandatory) that at least one adult have Emergency First Aid; however, in the case of EMS response time of 30 minutes to 1 hour, required to have Emergency First Aid.
- ♣ Red at least one adult must have Standard First Aid

Using McNab's Island as an example and the type of activities that make take place, the event could be either Yellow or Red. It is important that Guiders obtain the response time for their location (consult local fire department/EHS). The SG.1 needs to be clear and detailed enough in relation to the where and the what of the activity so that parents/guardians have a clear picture of where the girl will be and what the girl will be doing during the activity. With respect to McNab's Island and other locations with a possible EMS response time of over one hour, Assessors will ask further questions if the SG.1 does not give a clear picture of the activity in order to determine the EMS response time.

It is important that this assessment be conducted as it impacts Safe Guide paperwork filing. If your event ends up being Red level, paperwork must be submitted 21 days in advance of the activity (rather than 14 days for Yellow level) and the first aider must have Standard first aid (rather than Emergency).

Myth Busters

If a contract / lease is for less that one year, the Guider or District Commissioner can sign.



Contracts for less that one year are "short term contracts" and must be signed by the PC or her delegate. More information on contracts is in Guiding Essential. Contracts are to be completed by the member and forwarded to ns-officemanager@girlguides.ca for processing. Please allow 5 business days for processing.

Girl Assistants do not need to be registered in a separate unit such as Pathfinders or Rangers in addition to the unit they are volunteering in.



Girl Assistants can volunteer in units two levels below the one they designated for their age -group (Rangers volunteer with Guides and lower, Pathfinders with Brownies and lower). However, if they do not want to be in a Pathfinder or Ranger group, they may register in the unit they are volunteering in. More information on Girl
